### **Parish Councillors**

At our July meeting Clare Price was co-opted and welcomed as a Parish Councillor. Clare has extensive local knowledge and an enthusiasm for our environment.

There remain two vacancies. Anyone with an interest could attend our next routine meeting on Thursday 21st November at 7.30pm in Chilworth Infant School. There is also our annual public meeting for The Friends of Gunpowder Mills and other local matters. #### Planning

Number 74 New Road was the oldest Victorian house and the only double-fronted dwelling in New Road. To give it a measure of protection, both of Chilworth's Parish Councils applied to have it locally listed. Guildford Borough Council replied that it was a typical Victorian house and not worthy of Local Listing. It's true that in relation to Guilford's town centre, it is an ordinary Victorian dwelling but, in Chilworth, it was very special. We were disappointed with the Borough's decision. The house has now been demolished, a loss for our community.

We continue to study and comment on local planning applications. These include those relating to trees. Many of these relate to trees on properties within the Chilworth Conservation Area; where it is necessary to apply for permission before carrying out any significant tree work.

#### **Footpaths and Bridleways**

Our footpaths and bridleways are cut back less frequently nowadays. Hence, we receive numerous complaints regarding obstructive growth. These are forwarded to the relevant authorities, requesting action to be taken. Parish Councillors help where and when they can – usually carrying a pair of secateurs when out in the Parish!
